The Department of Education has introduced updates to the Child Safe Standards to further strengthen child safety across Victorian schools.

These updates continue to emphasise:

- Child safety and wellbeing as a shared responsibility
- The importance of student voice and participation
- Culturally safe environments for Aboriginal children and young people
- Inclusive and safe environments for children with disability and children from diverse backgrounds
- Clear processes for reporting concerns and responding to complaints

Langley Primary School remains committed to providing a safe, supportive and inclusive environment where every child can learn and thrive.

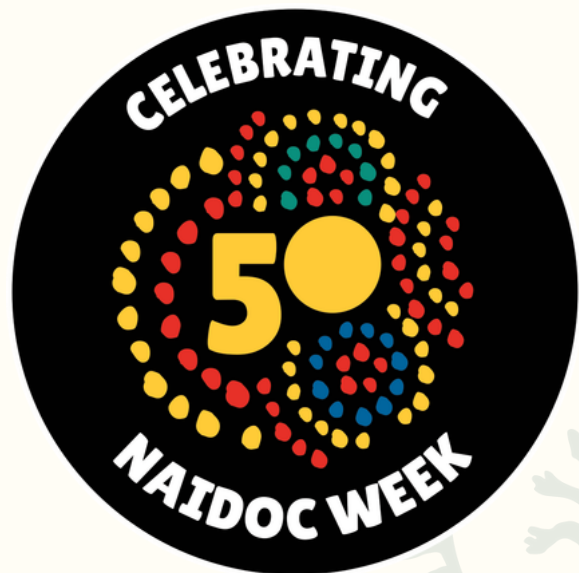
NAIDOC Week 2026

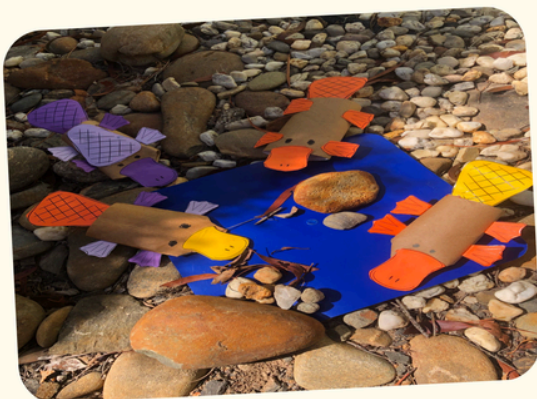

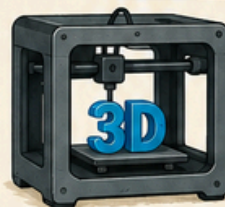
